

## **Program Terms**

The CSID driveway paver rebate will only be granted for new projects when pervious pavers are installed by a 3<sup>rd</sup> party contractor. This rebate applies to pervious pavers only. <a href="http://stormwater.wef.org/2013/10/pervious-permeable-porous-pavers-really">http://stormwater.wef.org/2013/10/pervious-permeable-porous-pavers-really</a> describes the differences between pervious, porous and permeable.

Before the start of the project, CSID must receive a copy of the permit issued by the City of Coral Springs, along with the associated plans, sketches or drawings.

Please do not start the project until receiving a NOTICE TO PROCEED from CSID. Doing so may jeopardize rebate eligibility. We need necessary back up and supporting documentation.

- 1. CSID must receive a copy of the estimate of the project before installation. The estimate must state the date, size (thickness) and color of material, and the square footage of area being paved. The pavers should be certified as "pervious" not porous or permeable. As-built sketch or plan submitted to City for permit should be required by CSID to ensure proper construction of base. Slate, Cement Block, Travertine tile, Chattahoochee and other non-pervious materials do not qualify for the CSID paver rebate.
- 2. CSID must receive a BEFORE AND AFTER picture of the project. We rely on the applicant to provide Before and After photographic documentation?
- 3. CSID must receive a copy of the paid invoice for our records.
- 4. You must supply documentation to CSID that the CITY issued permit associated with this project has been closed out.

Once we receive all necessary documentation, a Rebate check in the amount of \$250 will be submitted for payment. CSID is sponsoring this (one-time only) rebate. The rebate is not an annual. Only one rebate allowed per property ID.
