#### FIRST ORDER OF BUSINESS Roll Call

Mr. Cassel called the meeting to order and called the roll.

# SECOND ORDER OF BUSINESS Approval of the Minutes of the October 16, 2017 Meeting

Each Board member received a copy of the minutes of the October 16, 2017 meeting and Dr. Shank requested any corrections, additions or deletions.

Once change was made and will be reflected in the amended copy of the minutes.

**Unapproved Minutes** 

On MOTION by Mr. Holland seconded by Mr. St. Cavish with all in favor the minutes of the October 16, 2017 meeting were approved as amended.

#### THIRD ORDER OF BUSINESS

#### FOURTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Approval of Financial Statements for October 2017

Ms. Rubio reviewed the financial statements.

On MOTION by Mr. St. Cavish seconded by Mr. Holland with all in favor the financials were approved.

#### FIFTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

**Budget Amendments** 

A. Resolution 2018-1, Amending the General Fund Budget

On MOTION by Mr. St. Cavish seconded by Mr. Holland with all in favor Resolution 2018-1, amending the general fund budget, was adopted.

### B. Resolution 2018-2, Amending the Water and Sewer Budget

On MOTION by Mr. St. Cavish seconded by Mr. Holland with all in favor Resolution 2018-2, amending the water and sewer fund budget, was adopted.

#### SIXTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Presentation of West Outfall Canal Construction Project – James Maguire

Mr. Maguire provided a PowerPoint presentation on Sunshine Water Control District's West Outfall Construction Project. A copy of the presentation is attached hereto and made part of the public record. SWCD is requesting leniency from CSID for the residents affected as they will need to water their lawns from November of 2018 to May of 2019.

Mr. Daly indicated the Board will discuss this separately.

Mr. Morera addressed the Board and stated there may be pushback from affected residents.

### SEVENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS Presentation on General Fund Methodology (Placeholder)

Ms. Quinn met with Mr. Daly and Mr. Cassel today to review the preliminary results. She provided the Board with a presentation, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part of the public record.

Discussion ensued and there was consensus to go with EBU if the data is obtained. If not, the tier approach will be used.

#### TENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

## LMK Pipe Renewal and Consideration of Contract to Repair Lift Station #2

Mr. Gulyas provided the Board with a presentation on the lift station project, a copy of which is attached hereto and made part of the public record.

The Board reviewed proposals #1 and #2.

On MOTION by Mr. St. Cavish seconded by Mr. Holland with all in favor Proposals #1 and #2 from LMK to repair lift station #2 for a total cost of \$931,215.60 was approved.

#### **EIGHTH ORDER OF BUSINESS**

# Review and Discussion of Dock Policy (Tabled Item)

Mr. Lewis distributed and reviewed the revised Dock Policy, which incorporates previously discussed changes. A copy of the revised Dock Policy draft is attached hereto and made a part of the public record.

- Mr. St. Cavish stated the policy does not include the actions the District will take if someone does not apply for an encroachment agreement. Mr. Lewis noted the District can go to Circuit Court and sue the property owner, seeking injunctive relief.
- Mr. Lewis will insert verbiage regarding injunctive relief.

On MOTION by Mr. Holland seconded by Mr. St. Cavish with all in favor the Dock Policy was approved with the additional language regarding injunctive relief.

#### NINTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

# Discussion on Delinquency Fees and Policy

The Board discussed delinquency fees and there was consensus to apply a \$25 delinquency fee per month for any accounts past due at the time of the next billing cycle. A public hearing to formally adopt the fee will be advertised for the December 18, 2017 meeting.

#### **ELEVENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS**

Consideration of Proposal from Florida Technical Consultants to Provide GIS Asset Management Training and Support Services in the Amount of \$24,550

Mr. Dwiggins reviewed the proposal from FTC, which piggybacks off of a contract with the Town of Jupiter Island.

On MOTION by Mr. Holland seconded by Mr. St. Cavish with all in favor the proposal from Florida Technical Consultants was approved at a total cost of \$24,550.

#### TWELFTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Resolution 2018-3, Approving Swimming Pool Fill or Refill Policy for Commercial and Multifamily Properties

Mr. Daly reviewed the pool fill/refill credit policy for commercial and multifamily properties as indicated on Resolution 2018-3.

- The credit will be calculated based on the size/gallons needed to fill the pool.
- It will be a sewer credit calculated at the first pricing tier rate provided the pool is filled from a meter that is levied both water and sewer rates.
- The credit is available once a year, measured from the date an initial credit is granted.

On MOTION by Mr. St. Cavish seconded by Mr. Holland with all in favor Resolution 2018-3, approving swimming pool fill or refill policy for commercial and multifamily properties, was adopted.

#### THIRTEENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

Consideration of Change Order #1 to Lift Station 33 Contract with Trio for a Total Decrease of \$20,251.11

On MOTION by Mr. Holland seconded by Mr. St. Cavish with all in favor Change Order #1 to Lift Station 33 contract with Trio was approved for a total decrease of \$20,251.11.

#### FOURTEENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

#### **Staff Reports**

#### A. Manager – Ken Cassel

Mr. Cassel reported the following:

- They are working on closing out the permit for Fire Station #95. There are a few special conditions they need to meeting: installing a gate in the back fence and installing a fence in the front. The gate may not be necessary; however, the fence preventing public access is necessary.
- Our Lady of Health is working on an easement issue. They have been notified removal of the tree, which fell into the canal area, is their responsibility.

#### B. Engineer – Rick Olson

Mr. Olson reviewed the project status report, a copy of which is attached hereto and made a part of the public record.

#### • Utilities Update (David McIntosh)

Mr. McIntosh stated they are still working with FEMA on the disaster debris removal from the canals. A formal exploratory call will take place tomorrow morning. A site visit will be set after this discussion to examine the destruction. If everything is approved, funds will be available within two months.

As part of the forms they sent, they ask about the potential for mitigation. Quotes are being obtained to remove all trees from rights-of-ways as part of mitigation.

#### • Water – Joe Stephens (Report Included)

A copy of the report was included in the agenda package and is attached hereto as part of the public record. Mr. Stephens also reported he reviewed the terms of the contract for the State Fluoride Grant with Ms. Rubio and Mr. McIntosh. He sent questions on the contract to the State today.

#### • Stormwater – Afzal Hosein (Report Included)

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# **Fifth Order of Business**

#### **RESOLUTION 2018-4**

**WHEREAS**, Section 51(1) of Chapter 2004-469, Laws of Florida authorizes the Board of Supervisors of the Coral Springs Improvement District to charge reasonable penalties against any user or property for water or sewer service charges that are delinquent; and,

**WHEREAS**, Section 52 of Chapter 2004-469, Laws of Florida authorizes the Board of Supervisors of the Coral Springs Improvement District to recover delinquent water or sewer fees or charges as well as attorney's fees and costs, in circuit court whenever such fees or charges have been in default for thirty (30) days or longer; and,

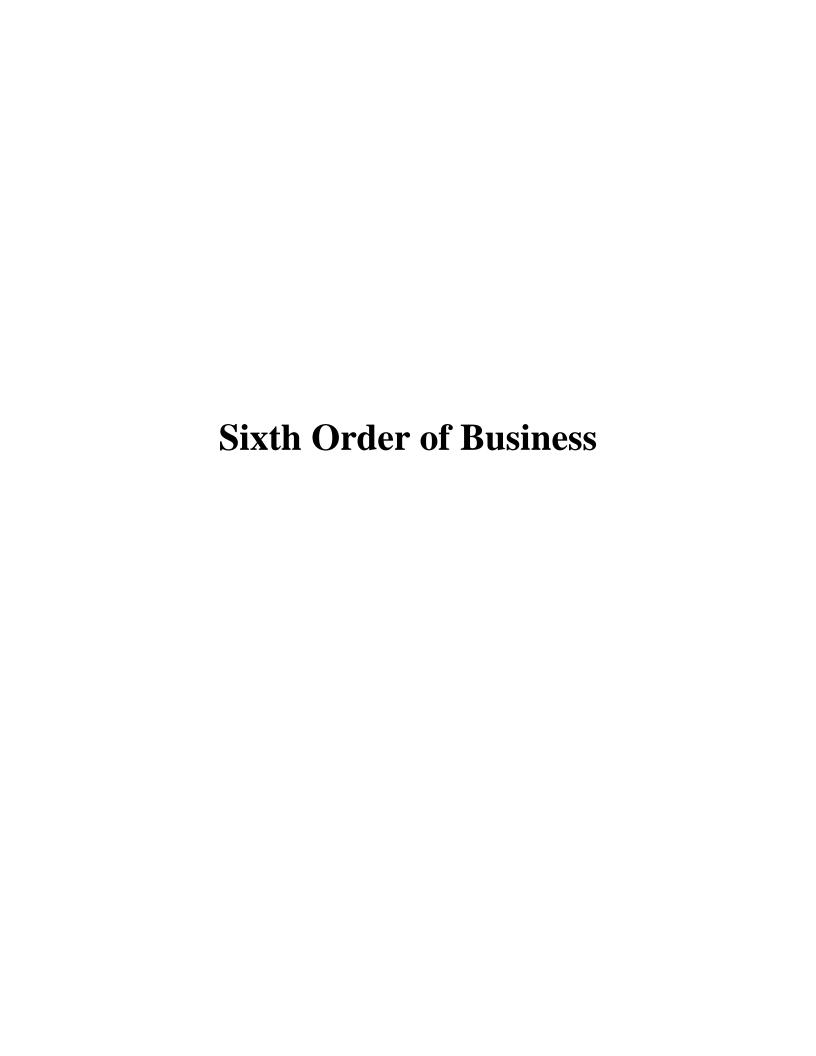
**WHEREAS**, the Board of Supervisors has published a notice dated December 7, 2017 of its intent to conduct a public hearing and adopt a schedule of fees for delinquent water or sewer service in a daily newspaper of general circulation in Broward County, Florida.

### NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE CORAL SPRINGS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT, THAT:

- 1. Water or sewer service fees or charges to customers of the Coral Springs Improvement District that have not been paid within thirty (30) days of their due date shall be deemed delinquent and each subsequent monthly bill shall include an additional delinquency fee of \$25.00 for each month the account is delinquent until the account is brought current.
- 2. Delinquency fees shall be charged beginning on the date the account fails to have a zero balance and the next monthly bill has been processed.
- 3. In the event the delinquent account is not brought current within ninety (90) days of the first delinquency charge, the Board of Supervisors may direct District Counsel to proceed to circuit court to recover all fees or charges as well as reasonable attorney's fees and costs.

Dear Supervisors,

Based upon our existing contract, Rostan Solutions is pleased to provide this estimate for monitoring the collection of Hurricane Irma debris removal from the Coral Springs Improvement District's canals. This work would be performed consistent with FEMA guidelines for debris monitoring. The restricted access available for this work will present certain operational challenges that have been taken into account in the development of this estimate.

Additionally, we have factored in time for a FEMA reimbursement specialist to aid the district in seeking FEMA reimbursement for this work. This will be valuable given the grey areas between NRCS and FEMA eligibility.

We have not included time for monitoring non-easement debris that may be located adjacent to the waterways but not eligible for FEMA reimbursement. It is important that collection of reimbursable debris occur separate from any other debris management activities, comingling, debris collection between eligible and non-eligible areas can jeopardize overall FEMA reimbursement.

We conservatively estimated a duration of 75 days to complete this work with a monitoring budget of \$435,000. Overall duration will ultimately be dictated by the resources that P&J brings to bear on the project. We are ready to support those efforts immediately. Our estimate includes monitoring leaners/hangers/stump removal, ROW debris removal, DMS monitoring and haul out monitoring.

#### **WORK AUTHORIZATION**

CSID WA No. 130 Globaltech No. 151062

Pursuant to the provisions contained in the "Contract for Professional Engineering Consulting and Design-Build Services on a Continuing Contract Basis " between the <u>CORAL SPRINGS IMPROVEMENT DISTRICT</u>, hereinafter referred to as "OWNER", and <u>Globaltech, Inc.</u>, hereinafter referred to as "FIRM", dated <u>July 1</u>, <u>2012</u> (hereinafter referred to as "AGREEMENT"), this Work Authorization authorizes the FIRM to provide services under the terms and conditions set forth herein and in the AGREEMENT, which is incorporated herein by reference as though set forth in full.

The OWNER desires design-build services related to the <u>CSID WWTP Plant D</u> <u>Damage Assessment</u>, hereinafter referred to as the "Specific Project".

#### Section 1 – Terms

FIRM shall be defined as an individual, corporation or contractor having a direct contract with the OWNER or with any other subcontractor in the performance of a part of the work contracted for under the terms of this Work Authorization with the OWNER.

#### Section 2 - Scope of Work

Plant D is a package plant at the CSID wastewater treatment plant (WWTP) with an aeration section and a clarification section. It was constructed within an abandoned clarifier structure. The floor in the clarifier section of Plant D has experienced some recent damage. It appears to have been lifted up. There is also damage to the clarifier mechanism arms, the Waste Activated Sludge (WAS) pipe appears to have been displaced and the axial wall in aeration section appears to have separated from the interior and exterior walls. The scope of this Work Authorization is to review the existing drawings and conduct onsite inspections to

develop a summary report for the probable cause of the damage and include recommendations, with costs, for corrective action. After initial review, the FIRM may need to have a core taken of the floor and/or other testing. This Work authorization includes an allowance of \$7,500 for corings and other outside testing that may be required.

The scope of services for this Work Authorization is as follows:

#### **Engineering Services**

- 1. Attend preliminary scoping meeting/site visit with the OWNER to review project scope.
- 2. Collect available existing information on the Plant D design/construction as well as existing information on the original clarifier.
- Conduct site visit inspections inside Plant D. During the site visit(s) the FIRM may determine that concrete corings and/or other concrete or steel testing may be necessary.
- 4. Develop an opinion of the probable cause of failure and recommendation(s) for corrective action. Develop costs for the recommended corrective action(s).
- 5. Prepare a report summarizing the results of this investigation. No CAD drawings will be prepared under this Work Authorization. Hand drawings may be included, if needed. Submit five (5) copies of the draft report to the OWNER.
- 6. Meet with the OWNER to discuss the draft report and collect OWNER comments.
- 7. Incorporate the OWNER comments into a final report. Submit five (5) copies of the final report to the OWNER.

#### **Assumptions**

Assumptions for the project are as follows:

- OWNER will drain and completely clean the entire interior of Plant D. It
  is very important that the assessment crew be able to visually inspect all
  areas of Plant D.
- The OWNER will provide ladders and any required safety equipment (other than harnesses) to access all areas of Plant D. Plant D, below the walkway, is considered a confined space.
- No construction services are included in this Work Authorization.
- An allowance of \$7,500 is included with this project. Allowance is only
  to be accessed with OWNER's written approval. Unused portion of
  allowance to be credited back to OWNER. Allowance is in place for use
  at the OWNER's discretion for concrete corings or other testing.

#### Section 3 – Location

The services to be performed by the FIRM shall be at the CSID Wastewater Treatment Plant.

#### Section 4 - Deliverables

The FIRM will provide the following Deliverables to OWNER:

 Draft and final summary report of findings with recommendations and costs for corrective action.

#### Section 5 - Time of Performance

Project will commence after execution of this Work Authorization and a Notice to Proceed is issued by OWNER. The FIRM and OWNER agree to the following schedule:

#### Section 6 - Method and Amount of Compensation

- The FIRM shall be paid by the OWNER in accordance with the Florida's Prompt Payment Act Florida Statute 218.70-79 and in accordance with the payment method as set forth in Section 6 of the AGREEMENT. The calculations shall begin using the date the invoice was received.
- 2. Total job price: \$41,330.00 (including \$7,500 allowance).
- 3. On the terms contained in the FIRM's said proposal for the doing of said work and the said award therefore, and the specifications herein specifically referred to and made a part of this contract.
- 4. The cost for the above scope of services is a lump sum (LS). The LS is based on the materials, methods, and assumptions presented in the scope of services and may be adjusted based on final detail design and alternative selections or omissions. The LS shall not be greater than the stated amount unless there is an approved increase in the scope of services.
- 5. A Budget Summary for the above LS is provided in Attachment A.

#### Section 7 – Application for Progress Payment

 Unless otherwise prescribed by law, at the end of each month, the FIRM shall submit to the OWNER for review, an Application for Progress Payment filled out and signed by the FIRM covering the Work completed as of the date of the Application and accompanied by such supporting documentation as is required by the AGREEMENT.

#### Section 8 – Responsibilities

The FIRM shall, under no circumstance, look to the OWNER to provide any labor or equipment for the FIRM. The FIRM shall provide all of the labor and equipment necessary to perform the job or services contracted for at the expense of the FIRM. Property of any kind that may be on the premises, which are the site of the performance of this contract, during the performance of this Work Authorization, shall be at the sole risk of the FIRM.

- **8.1** The OWNER hereby designates <u>Tim Martin</u> as the OWNER's representative.
- **8.2** In addition to applicable provisions of Section 2 of the AGREEMENT, the OWNER will:
  - Provide copies of existing drawings and equipment cut sheets if requested by FIRM
  - Pay for any required permit fees

The FIRM acknowledges and understands that it is an independent contractor in its relationship with the OWNER. The FIRM hereby designates <u>David Schuman</u> as the FIRM's representative.

#### Section 9 - Insurance

The FIRM shall provide certificate of insurance to the OWNER setting forth the type and amount of insurance carried by the FIRM and conforming to the minimum requirements set forth in the AGREEMENT.

#### Section 10 - Level of Service

The OWNER shall have the right to terminate said Agreement by giving the FIRM thirty (30) days written notice if the service that is being provided is not maintained at levels necessary to provide the required service. The OWNER will determine in its sole judgment what constitutes a satisfactory level of service.

#### Section 11 – Indemnification

The Firm shall indemnify and hold harmless the Owner and its officers and employees as set forth in Section 11 of the Agreement.

Owner and Owner's Agent (collectively as Applicant) agree to pay the Coral Springs Improvement District all reimbursable costs and consulting engineer's fees incurred as a result of pre-design or pre-application consultations, review and processing of applications for land development, utilization of District Right of Way, and inspection of improvements even if an application is not formally submitted, approved by the District or constructed by the applicant. Reimbursable costs include without limitation the costs of retaining professional and technical consultants services and any services necessary to perform functions related to review and processing of the applications and inspection of the work.

Applicant will pay one or more deposits to cover the costs noted above at such times and of such amounts as requested by the Manager of the Coral Springs Improvement District or their designee. Upon the execution of this agreement the applicant shall deposit with the Coral Springs Improvement District \$\, \quad \text{.00} (SWM -\\$5,000; ROW -\\$5,000; Variance -\\$10,000; Water -\\$4,000; Sewer \\$4,000) against which the District will charge its reimbursable costs on a monthly basis.

The District shall deliver periodic statements to the applicant showing the reimbursable costs incurred by the District. Said statements shall show how much of the deposit is to used to pay invoiced monthly costs, how much of the deposit remains and how much the applicant must pay to the District if anything. With the monthly invoice the District shall supply the applicant with documentation supporting the amounts charged against the applicant's deposit and /or for which the District is demanding payment. Failure of the applicant to object to an invoice, its content and/or its supporting documentation in writing within 30 days of applicant's receipt of said invoice shall be deemed a conclusive waiver of such objection.

In the event the applicant timely objects to an invoice and the District incurs additional costs in review, researching, and responding to said objection the District will charge said additional costs against the deposit or if there is insufficient deposit to pay said additional costs the applicant shall pay said costs to the District within 30 days of the District's direction to do so, provided however that the District will not

charge such additional costs against the deposit or applicant if the objection has substantive merit in that the invoice charges were incorrect or inaccurate.

In the event the deposit falls below 25% of the original amount of the deposit or is expected to do so within 30 days, the applicant shall within 15 days of notice by the District, replenish the deposit to its original amount. Any amounts not paid by the applicant shall accrue interest at the rate of 1% per month until fully paid.

In the event any approval is appealed, additional amounts shall be required to be paid to the District by the applicant and payment thereof shall be a condition precedent to the processing of such appeal.

### December Report to the Board of Directors for the Water Plant Report Includes Updates through 12/6/2017

#### **Concentrate valve replacement**

This project is complete and we are now operating at 85% recovery with the new larger valves. We have made several adjustments to our pretreatment reducing the amount of antiscalant and sulfuric acid that is being fed. We expect to have the acid for pretreatment turned completely off by the end of December.

#### Meeting with Globaltech

On 10/12 David, Tim, and I met with Globaltech to go over the projects that are budgeted for Fiscal Year 2017/18. We presented them with all of the projects we have planned for this year and prioritized the projects for them. This should make it easier on both of us to get these projects completed before the next FY starts. They are beginning to prepare work authorizations for each project which will be presented to the board for approval after staff has reviewed and approved each one. At this point we have not received any new WA's to review.

#### **Train feed motor bearings**

We obtained three quotes to replace the bearings on one of our trains' feed motors. Condo Electric came in the lowest at \$3,995. They have refurbished the motor we provided them and have returned it to our site. They are planning on installing this motor on train #3 on 12/7. If we are happy with the performance of the motor they worked on we will turn over another motor to them to have the bearings replaced on that one as well.

#### <u>Fluoridation system upgrade</u> (Grant)

The Florida Dental Health Program has offered us a grant in the amount of \$205,000 to upgrade our fluoridation system. This is the oldest chemical feed system at the water plant and is in need of replacing. We have gone through the preliminary contract terms with the State and are now just awaiting receipt of the final contract for review and signatures before we can begin the project. We are hoping to have this by the December meeting.

#### Hypochlorite tank replacements

A work authorization, presented by Globaltech, to replace our two older hypochlorite tanks was approved at the October meeting. We are still waiting for drawings from Globaltech to review. Once the drawings are approved Globaltech will order the tanks which we expect to happen by mid-December. The tanks have a 3 month lead time once ordered.

#### **Lead and Copper further reduced monitoring**

After going through Florida's Administrative Code chapter 62-550.800 thoroughly we identified that based on our past performance in regards to lead and copper testing we may have been eligible to move to further reduced monitoring for these two constituent's. We were already on a reduced testing frequency of having to only sample once per year. We approached the Health Department with this information and after review they have approved our system to move to triennial monitoring. This will result in an annual cost savings of \$2,100.

#### **Train 3 second stage cleaning**

We performed a cleaning of the second stage on train #3 to remove some significant scaling that we experienced. The cleaning was very successful and the train is back to its original, expected performance. The contractor that came in to assist us was so impressed with our cleaning practices and what we have implemented to our process that he has asked us to deliver a PowerPoint presentation on our methods and experiences at the SEDA (South East Desalting Association) spring symposium in Captiva Island next year.

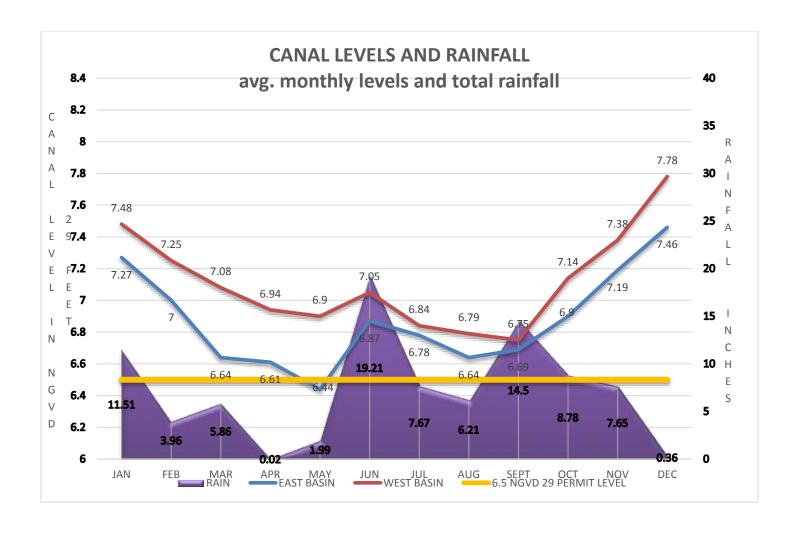

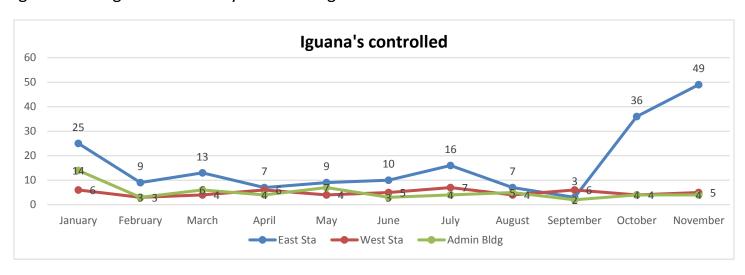

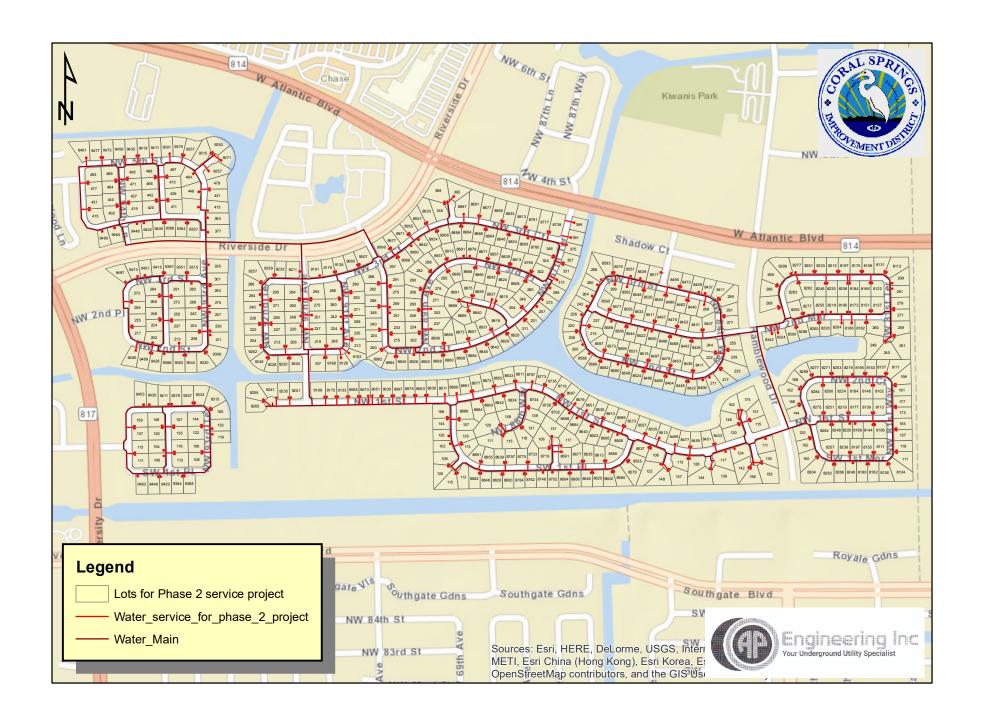
#### 12-18-17 board Meeting

- There were 14 water breaks in the month of November, a record low in my collected data.
- AP Engineering is finishing up in Ramblewood subdivision. A.P. has still estimated the substantial completion date to be December 19<sup>th</sup>.
- The area for Phase 2 of our Service Line Replacement Project has been outlined, based on historical GIS data. (in my report) Completion of Phase two will impact 1664 Lots in 4 different Subdivisions. The areas that are affected, The remaining southern section of Cypress Run, the eastern side of Cypress Glen, All of Oakwood and Shadow wood Subdivisions.
- The Margate/CSID interconnect projects main construction is mostly complete. Pressure testing and bacteriological samples were taken, passed, and have been submitted to the county for approval. When this is complete, the Remaining Margate section will be completed.
- We have received delivery of our 8.5" x 20" cargo trailer and we are in the process of outfitting it for its intended use.

#### **CRC Proposal 69**

#### What does the proposal do?

In essence, Proposal 69 requires that a special district's authority to levy an ad valorem tax must be re-authorized by a vote of the property owners in the district every 10 years. If a referendum fails, the Legislature is directed to dissolve, merge, consolidate or take "other appropriate disposition" action for the district.

#### What types of districts are affected?

There are many types of districts that have the authority to levy ad valorem taxes, including port and airport authorities, inlet/navigation districts, community development districts, fire/rescue districts, mosquito control districts, water/sewer districts, healthcare districts and children's services districts. The number of districts that have the authority to levy an ad valorem tax is in excess of 800, though only about 200 actually levy a tax. All would be affected by Proposal 69.

#### **Issues with Proposal 69**

- Taxes are shifted not eliminated: Special districts are limited-purpose local governments that can only spend money on the specific service or infrastructure for which they are authorized. If a district is dissolved, the need for the service or infrastructure still remains so either the county or city will have to assume the obligation and raise the revenue to pay for it. Taxpayers will not save money and, in fact, could end up paying more for the same service.
- Public Financing Implications: Large public infrastructure projects are typically funded through tax-exempt, municipal bonding, which reduces the cost to taxpayers and spreads the cost over multiple years. Bonds are usually issued for terms of 20-30 years. Proposal 69 would necessarily limit the term of a bond to 10 years, likely making such bonds unmarketable. As a result, the districts affected by Proposal 69 will find it difficult to finance important public projects that support growth and commerce like port/airport expansions, roads, fire stations and libraries. If public financing cannot be secured, the projects will either not be constructed or the districts, and ultimately the taxpayers, will pay an increased cost for the projects.
- <u>Unfunded Liabilities</u>: By law, any assets or liabilities of a dissolved district become the responsibility of the county or city in which the district is located. Some of the affected districts have pension plans for their employees. Like most public pension plans, the district plans have current unfunded liabilities, likely in the hundreds of millions of dollars statewide. These and other liabilities would become the responsibility of the county or city and their residents, rather than the responsibility of the district and its residents.
- <u>Multi-County Districts</u>: There are a number of affected districts that encompass more than one county, such as the Florida Inland Navigation District that includes all 13 counties on

the east coast of Florida and is charged with maintaining the intercoastal waterway for commercial and recreational boating. What happens if some of the counties vote in favor of a district but others vote against?

- Not all Floridians affected: Constitutional amendments should address issues affecting all Floridians. The vast majority of special districts in Florida are located from Orlando south. If placed on the ballot, all Florida electors will be able to vote on Proposal 69 even though many Floridians do not live in special districts with tax authority and are unfamiliar with special districts.
- Only property owners get a vote: The local referenda required by Proposal 69 is only of those "electors who are the owners of freeholds", i.e. property owners. This means that non-property owners, like renters, who benefit from the service and infrastructure provided by districts will not get a vote.

#### **CRC Proposal 69 is unnecessary**

- <u>Voters have already approved ad valorem tax</u>: The Florida Constitution (Article VII, Section 9) already requires that voters approve by referendum any ad valorem tax levied by a special district.
- <u>Legislature already has the authority</u>: Any time it desires, the Legislature can modify, dissolve, merge or consolidate a district, including eliminating its ability to levy taxes. It can also require a district be reauthorized by the voters.
- <u>District residents can enact change</u>: If desired, the residents of a district can enact change through exercising their right to vote in new governing board members, attending public district meetings and voicing their concerns, bringing concerns to local legislators and requesting legislative review of the district, etc.
- <u>2012 Review of Special Districts:</u> In 2012, Governor Scott issued an Executive Order requiring his office to review all special districts in Florida. Though not all districts were ultimately reviewed, the published reports were largely complimentary of the quality of service provided and the fiscal efficiency of the districts.
